FACE TO FACE TEACHING BRINGS BENEFITS

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As the second full week of lessons comes to a close, we are starting to see the real benefits of face to face teaching. From speaking to students, it is clear that they feel increasingly confident in their studies, and in their ability to succeed in their courses. Teachers have reported excellent engagement from students in the new timetable, and I have been impressed by the way the students have responded to the new arrangements in the building.

During the week, we have shared with students and parents our decision to require face coverings in public areas of the building from Monday 21st September. Please see the coronavirus update page of the website [LINK] for more information. I would encourage any student with concerns over this to speak to their coach in the first instance.

Also this week, we have worked closely with Newcastle Council and Public Health England to ensure we have taken the appropriate steps to follow up on 1 member of staff and 2 students who have tested positive for coronavirus. All students and staff identified as close contacts have been informed and are now self isolating. I am pleased that we have been able to stream live lessons to these students from the classroom to allow them to stay on track with the work.

At this stage, no further action is required. Nevertheless, there are things we can all do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19:

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- · cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- · put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards

Ensure you choose 'Student' when registering, so that people within the conference know you are a student. You can also fill in your school/ college name when registering. Once you have registered and chosen a password you can login to the portal as and when you like.

The Waterline Summit is live from 9:00am Monday 19th – 5:00pm Friday 23rd – it will then switch to on-demand days. During the live days you will have access to instant chat with both attendees and exhibitors as well as being able to take part in live webinars including Q&A sessions. Once the live days are over, you will still be able to login to the Summit and browse the content, you can still add content to your delegate back for downloading and leave messages for exhibitors to get back to you.

You can access the Summit using a desktop computer, laptop, tablet, or mobile device. The exhibitors of this years summit have been set criteria to meet which includes not only showcasing a sustainable story related to their business but also to include information and downloadable content about skills and careers in sustainability and what careers look like in the future of climate change.

We have also asked exhibitors to include a skills and careers representative to their virtual booths so that students can ask live questions using the chat function or leave a company a message should they wish to.

All appointments will take place in the college Library.

A Bursary of up to ± 1200 is available for students living in a household with an income of $\pm 28,000$ or less, providing appropriate documentary evidence in support of the application can be presented.

The amount of support a student receives is dependent on the miles travelled from home to college. In addition to the household income criteria, students must have a bank account in their own name that can accept BACS payments. Students are also required to maintain attendance levels of 95% or above in every aspect of their study programme.
