

STUDENT GATEWAY OPEN TO STUDENTS

We have created spaces in our Gateway on the ground floor of the building for a small number of students on a half day basis, so that they can come and study and have access to IT.

These spaces are available on an advanced booking only system. You will be allocated a desk number, and on each day which you have booked, that desk will be available for you to access IT and study during your Independent Study block. Areas will be cleaned daily and you will be required to arrive and depart on time, to avoid overlapping with students in other year groups.

When you arrive at the Gateway, you will need to log in with the member of staff in the Gateway. These desks are available on a first come first served basis. To book a space use the following links:

REMAINING BURSARY APPLICATIONS

From week commencing the 5th October bursary assessments will be taking place from the office window as drop-ins (so no appointment required); Tues, Wed and Thurs only

Year 1 - 8.45-9.15 Year 2 - 9.40- 10.10 A2LV3 - 10.20 - 10.50

Any new assessments undertaken from w/c 12 October will not receive any back payments, as we will have been assessing for 6 weeks at that point.

A Bursary of up to £1200 is available for students living in a household with an income of £28,000 or less, providing appropriate documentary evidence in support of the application can be presented.

The amount of support a student receives is dependent on the miles travelled from home to college. In addition to the household income criteria, students must have a bank account in their own name that can accept BACS payments. Students are also required to maintain attendance levels of 95% or above in every aspect of their study programme.



At Newcastle Sixth Form College, we will be taking part in a range of class based activities throughout October 2020, as part of Black History Month.

BHM COMPETITION

This October, one of the ways NSFC is celebrating Black History Month is by having a competition that's all about exploring black history. **BiM 360°**

To do this, we're asking students to contribute a creative piece that celebrates an influential figure(s) within Black History. This can look at their achievements, the challenges they have faced in their lives, and/or the how they have been involved in social justice. We love outside-of-the-box thinking here at NSFC so you can submit your creative piece in whatever medium you want – just make sure you're able to send it through an email and that you think about accessibility (for example, if you create a sculpture please send photos or videos with descriptions).

If you need a burst of inspiration, you can draw from the Black History Month programme we have put together on the college website and the activities you will be doing in your subject lessons to recognise Black History Month.

Here are a few examples of things you could think about doing, you could...:

- Write a poem in tribute to your favourite black poet
- Create an infographic about the civil rights campaigners
- Write a blog article on the most influential biopic films
- Create a short video/animation about how a black person has impacted your field of study

Selected creative pieces will be featured as part of an exhibition with winning entries will receiving gift vouchers. Creative pieces will be judged anonymously by a staff panel who will be looking at the contribution the entries have in celebrating Black History Month and at their creativity.
