We are pleased to announce that 3 students have already received offers from Oxford University, so progression plans are working well despite the disruption.



### MATHEMATICS

Working on Teams has been a really useful way of students sharing and collaborating with their work, as shown here with an inspiring A Level Maths class this week.

Introducing the theme of differentiation using curve stitching, the students produced and shared some exceptional work, and the learning was brought to life in a way not always available in the classroom.

The students have been enjoying the additional challenge of working on challenging complex tasks during live lessons, and the chance to showcase their own work and learn more from one another is really driving their A Level experience.
