




ELITE OXFORD UNIVERSITY COMPUTER CHALLENGE


We extend our congratulations to "TLDR" for emerging victorious in this ultimate showdown, securing the championship title.

Following the closure of university applications on UCAS deadline day, Newcastle Sixth Form College is celebrating a record year, with 7 students receiving offers from Oxford and Cambridge Universities.

The Oxbridge application process is rigorous and competition for places is always a significant test, so the success of our 7 students to achieve offers this year, is a testament to their hard work.

Oxbridge offers for this group of dedicated students cover a range of subjects from History and Politics, to Geography, Economics, French and Law. The diverse range of subjects shows the strength in depth and quality of learning which has been available to students over the last 2 years of their A Level programme. For these ambitious students the hard work is not over, as they now start to prepare for final A Level exams in May and June, but they have the confidence to know that their ambition will be rewarded with continued success.








We extend our sincere thanks to Animal Aid for their recent visit to NSFC.

It was fantastic to see such a diverse range of visitors sharing their experiences and insights into the world of literature and drama with our A Level students.






NEWCASTLE UNIVERSITY FINE ART WORKSHOPS









We're thrilled to announce a special collaboration between Newcastle Sixth Form College and Newcastle University's Fine Arts department!


For 5 weeks, students from Newcastle University will be joining us every Monday afternoon to deliver engaging skills-based workshops.
