
Charly was really nice and we did some icebreakers that made everyone loosen up a bit and start talking more

ADAPTING TO THE NEW COLLEGE ENVIRONMENT



We have worked hard all summer to ensure that the return to sixth form was as smooth as possible, and with the cooperation and support of all of our new students we are pleased to have the first week completed safely and securely, with students enjoying the chance to be back in full time education.

There has been a really positive response to our 'dedicated subject days' and the new approach is already working well across all subjects. This approach has ensured we could manage the arrival and departure of students in whole year bubbles, and we also have managed to allow for a staggered lunch break which means our corridors and communal areas have been carefully controlled. Some of the additional activities we have included to ensure our students have both a positive and safe experience in college include:

We are recommending that students wear face masks when in communal spaces and arriving and leaving the college. There is no requirement to wear masks during lessons. This approach has worked well so far, as many students come in using public transport and so are used to having their masks on, but we are encouraging students to remain disciplined all day, whilst on site, and help us keep the college a safe space for everyone.
