History organised a trip to see the 'Hamilton' stage production at the Festival Theatre in Edinburgh.












Geography organised a field trip to Amble to complete case studybased research.



Starting from The Old Repeater Station, our students embarked on a challenging 15km hike, navigating diverse weather conditions and terrain that tested their endurance and navigation skills. After learning how to pitch a tent, they camped overnight at Winshields before concluding their journey at the historic Turret 45A on Hadrian's Wall.

This expedition was a crucial part of the DofE silver award and has provided our students with hands-on experience in testing outdoor equipment, crafting detailed route cards, and mastering map reading and navigation.
