She also explored how the nature of news and media has evolved dramatically over the last 20 years, particularly with the rise of digital platforms and social media. Lastly, Helen provided practical advice on how to kickstart a career in journalism, including tips on building a portfolio, the importance of networking, and navigating the ever-changing media landscape.

£350k+ Investment in Student IT

Newcastle Sixth Form College Invests £350,000 in Cutting-Edge IT Facilities to Enhance Student Learning and University-Style Experience.



Newcastle Sixth Form College has invested over £350k in new IT suites across the entire college campus as part of improving college facilities for learners this summer. The new installation has brought new communal desk stations on each floor of the building in the Gateway Hub, Library, second and third floor IT spaces, and within classrooms across the site to ensure students can access the latest, fastest and best equipped hardware and software.

This investment, in the 10th year since the college opened will ensure the campus style facility has the benefit of fast connection speeds and I7 processors in all communal based computers, so that students can work and study within the college throughout the day.

Newcastle Sixth Form College has always been a site which feels much more like a university campus, and students are encouraged to work and study within the college, to maximise the benefits of being part of the college community and ensuring access to the academic and personal development support which is vital to students studying A Level. The facilities mirror a university style experience to provide students in the sixth form the step up and preparation they need to succeed at A Levels and also prepare for higher education. The hundreds of new desk stations will enhance the existing state of the art facilities, with many subjects having dedicated resources to ensure the best learning environment.

Installation was completed over the summer break in preparation for the arrival of our new Year 12 students this Autumn.

Our DofE Silver Award programme is in full swing with our biggest ever group of students developing their skills.

This year 36 of our Year 12 students have started their DofE Silver programme and are already completing the Physical, Skills and Volunteering programmes they need to complete to gain the award. This year is a particularly focussed group and with a summer expedition to cap of the activity with a practice and then 3 day trip along Hadrian's Wall, we are expecting great achievements from this years programme.

The Duke of Edinburgh Silver Award, like the Bronze Award is a fun programme, where young people can make friends, improve their selfesteem and build confidence. DofE Silver is ideal for students who are applying for prestigious university places as it shows the dedication, determination and willingness to develop new skills.







New College Oxford – Inspiring NSFC students

As part of our commitment to providing excellent progression opportunities, we were delighted to welcome Shelby Holmes, Senior Outreach Officer at New College, Oxford, to our sixth form to introduce New College's Step-Up programme to over 60 of our Year 12 students.

The Step-Up programme is designed to inspire and support students in making a competitive application to top universities, including but not limited to Oxford. As a sustained-contact scheme, it provides students with regular interaction with New College's Outreach team over two years. This ongoing support guides students through each stage of the university application process, making the prospect of attending Oxford both approachable and attainable.

We have identified over 100 students from our Year 12 cohort who have the ability to progress to Oxford, most of whom have already taken advantage of this five-step programme.

Step 1 is an introductory session about universities and challenges students' existing perceptions of the University of Oxford.

Step 2 is hosted at New College. Students have the chance to tour the facilities, meet current students and academics, and have a session on their current and future options.

Step 3 is all about understanding the application process, students will get a real sense of what is expected from successful candidates.

Step 4 helps students make a start on their personal statements, analysing existing statements to see what works well, what doesn't, and the kind of activities they could be doing to further their own subject interests.

Step 5 introduces students to Oxford interviews, informing them about the process and helping them prepare.

We're proud to be the only Sixth Form College in the North East participating in this impactful programme, and we look forward to working closely with New College Oxford to support our students over the next two years.





Student Showcase:

During our Journalism Enrichment, we asked a student the following: "Chloe, how has your first term been?"

"We have reached the end of our first term here at NSFC and what a term it's been. Whether you think it has flown by or the weeks have dragged and you're counting down the days until the holidays, we can all agree that it has been a wonderfully intense 4 months."

"In September we arrived with various expectations. Some of us were overjoyed to finally get out of secondary school and others were terrified to start A-Levels. Business & Economics Week



Later in the same week a dynamic workshop with Leeds Trinity University, where guest speakers from the Economics and Finance department led a live trading activity, and showcased the wide array of courses available to our students.

We were joined by an alumni student from Newcastle University who shared tips for undergraduate success during an inspiring Q&A session.

The week completed with insights from Professor Ron Beadle of Northumbria University and a lecture from Teesside University, where topics discussed included business studies as a degree option, career prospects, and the importance of academic skills paired with passion.

Newcastle College University Centre also delivered an insightful talk on degree options in business, law, and criminology, emphasising the integration of academic knowledge with practical skills. These career weeks really underpin the learning of our students and show the wide array of career paths available.
